




MG Links

As has been observed there are a few non-MG sports cars in the club, referring in particular to the Mazda MX5.

There is a link to the MG with this marque, not direct and perhaps a little imagination is required when making the assessment.

The link between the MX5 and the Lotus Elan is fairly obvious and will be observed by placing the early model Mazda MX 5 alongside this Lotus. There are also stories of how the constructors of the Mazda used the Lotus as a model, even if this is not the case they must have been sitting next to, or very close to a Lotus Elan during the design concept process of the MX 5? Certainly, pictures bear out design features of similarity?






Mazda MX5 Mazda MX5 early and current chassis

For the MG connection, a trip back a few years is required, 1935 would be a good place to start, although defiantly not the start of MG development, published articles point out a similar story to the above for the MG Type R Midget and Lotus Elan, the term used is influenced, loosely translated as copied would be the inference. The Type R MG is a single seater racing car produced in 1935 using a number of tried influences (or left over bits and pieces) from even earlier MG's. The features of the MG Type R as introduced are

the chassis utilising four wheel independent torsion bar suspension, pre-select gear box and the 746cc OHC engine and Zoller super charger, also in my opinion the fact that the car looks terrific, just what a car should look like. Apparently, there were ten produced and distributed to well known racing personalities of the day, Malcolm Campbell and Doreen Evans to name a couple, these cars were campaigned at Brooklands and Shelsley Walsh, with some venturing to Europe. The racing history of the MG Type R seems to be a mixed affair with a few good results and a lot of DNF's, but consensus at the time was, that with further development it would have been another story. At this time of the development, a Leonard Lord came on the scene and promptly closed the MG racing and other development departments, in my opinion the same thinking that at a later date unfortunately lead to an MG that could have looked and developed into something more interesting, considering its pedigree, after delivering one of the most attractive midget sports cars ever put on the road (MG TF 1250 and 1500) evolving into an encouraging development in the MGA to be followed by what was ultimately, a conclusion. Perhaps this story is continued and borne out by the Collin Chapman's Lotus Elan and Mazda's MX5 with no doubt heaps of other cars put on roads and tracks the world over. The adjacent features of the MG R Type are the independent four wheel suspension and the light weight Y configuration chassis obviously utilised in all three.

So anyone with a few questions about the MX5's that turn up for club runs and attend competition events under the MGCC and other clubs, may like to reflect on the marque links as outlined, a little thin, but then again, it could be said that all vehicles are relative since someone tripped over the wheel and considered it, to look like something useful?

Thinking an MG Type R may be an appealing addition in the shed or perhaps carriage house, there was an example being put up for sale with an expected going rate of UK£ 180,000, a little more than the Gumtree price of an MX5 and probably not as universally drivable but defiantly desirable?
