A Chat with Chris Wagstaff

Chris Wagstaff, known to many as Waggy, joined the MG Car club in 2006 and 5 years later was encouraged by other Club members to consider nomination for Chairman of the Southern Sub Centre Committee. Chris's suitability and rise to the dizzy heights of Chairman would not surprise those who know his work history which culminated as Project Manager for Telstra. These jobs require good communication, leadership, team building and general management skills. But Chris brings a devilish sense of humour, together with a tranquil, laid back and empowering approach - "you don't have to do everything yourself, do you?" he said. These skills and attributes have also contributed to Chris's success and passion with the Volunteer Fire Brigade, but more about this later.

Chris has had an interest in all things mechanical from his early years, and has owned about 12-15 cars during his lifetime. Of these, only two have been MGs but he's had these longer than the other cars he's owned which were sold/traded every few years. Chris's first job was car related as tyre fitter at Goodyear. He loves his MGs but considered the best car he's ever owned to be his first car, a two tone cream and grey Holden FJ Ute, which held the unofficial speed record from Cygnet to Huonville on dance nights.

Chris's first MG was an MGTC which he bought from Peter Thomas in the Mornington Peninsula. Peter was a well known historic racer and was selling about half a dozen collectable cars as he had a serious medical issue. Chris wasn't aware when he bought the MG that a car trailer was generously thrown in to get the car back to Hobart - this was very handy, and was borrowed by many in the Club over the years. Chris said the TC had a good motor with nothing major to be done other than fixing the drivers door, which had been welded up, to make it roadworthy.

In 2012 Chris bought his 1979 MGB LE, which had been converted to right hand drive. About 2,000 Limited Edition versions were made in the UK for the American market.

As mentioned, the Volunteer Fire Brigade plays a large part in Chris and Vicki's lives. Chris has been involved in the Fern Tree Fire Station as Fire fighter, Crew Leader, Safety Officer for various Volunteer Hobart Brigades, and addressing maintenance issues etc for 28 years. He is 2nd Officer and has had many intrastate and interstate deployments. It is a very responsible and demanding volunteer role over a large high risk area that overshadows Hobart. I wasn't aware that Chris and other Volunteer Fire Fighters are on call 24/7/365 for many emergencies in their Response Area (Fern Tree / Mt Wellington) including priority medicals eg heart attacks, motor vehicle incidents, injured mountain bike riders on the mountain trails, structure fires & vegetation fires On cue, he received a call to help remove a tree which had fallen over a driveway while we were having our chat. Chris deserves our accolades for the magnificent job he does volunteering so much of his time to the MG Car Club and the Fire Brigade - thanks and well done Chris.



But too much volunteering work makes Waggy a dull boy, so he and Vicki love to escape Tasmania each year. In the good old pre-Covid days, travel alternated between overseas (with Hawaii big island their favourite place) and within mainland Australia. Their Triton and Caravan is pictured below en route to the Northern Territory, and is soon to be replaced by a Motorhome. And when they are at home, he and Vicki always have plenty to do on their large property with a beautifully maintained garden which has 60 different Rhododendrons and many different varieties of Maple. There's always something to do and the old adage of asking a busy person if you want something done, certainly applies to Chris.






