The Penguin Hillclimb



Therefore at the event I presented to Barry Oliver, Chairman of the Board with the cheque of \$700. As Chairman, Barry was very appreciative of this donation and for the next 2 years.

The Club Day at Baskerville, due on Sunday 20th of March with the Jaguar and Mini Car Clubs of Tasmania, has been cancelled.

Next competition event is on Sunday 3rd April, a Multi-Club Motorkhana being held at Buckby Motors Symmons Plains Raceway. Tests will be those that will be used at this year's National Meeting later in April. Entry will be through Motorsport Australia Event Entry Portal.

PAST EVENTS

27th February - Bruny Island Run

Well the morning started out cloudy and overcast. I arrived first to collect the defibrillator and report book from the Civic Club. With 7 MG's and 2 Mazda MX5's we left the Civic Club in Davey St. just before 8.30 am to travel along the Southern Outlet to Kettering. On the way we picked up Bob and Di Leeson in their blue Merc Convertible, and new members Kevin van der veer and Kath Page in their Mazda MX5 who were waiting for us at Margate - making a total of 16 people. We arrived at Kettering at 9am just in time to grab a coffee before boarding the ferry.

The water was as calm as a mill pond (could nearly see your reflection in the water). It was a 10 minute ferry ride to Bruny Island with the ferry nearly full. On arrival the MG Car members headed along good sealed roads, stopping at the Isthmus Bay lookout on the neck of Bruny for half an hour to climb lots of flights of stairs to view to wonderful outlook of the sea and beautiful sandy beaches. Most of us, being retirees took a breather on the way up, until most of us made it to the top of the dunes to see the burrows in the sand where the fairy penguin live. You begin to realize how big Bruny Island is. It does not look big on the map but is a very long piece of farm land. Onward to Adventure Bay where we had another half hour stop for a coffee at the local shop and a visit to the Bligh Museum, established in 1954 by the late Dr Bruce Hamilton to display historic maps paintings and other artefacts relating to the landing at Adventure Bay by famous explorers: Tasman in 1642, Furneaux in 1773, Cook in 1777, Bligh in 1788 and 1792, D'Entrecasteaux in 1792, Flinders in 1793 and Baudin in 1802. It was well worth the \$4 entry fee to see such a great display of genuine artefacts and reports from the era.

Leaving Adventure Bay members headed to Alonnah for lunch and refreshments where a table of 15 awaited us. We ordered at the bar from a delightful menu, the most popular being the fish and chips with large pieces of fresh and tasty fish. There was also a huge chicken parmigiana, steak and delicious tender lamb on offer.

After lunch we intended going south to the lighthouse but were put off by the gravel section of road so decided to try for Dennes Point instead. As we left Alonnah light drizzle started and as we travelled North the drizzle became heavier. Alan Briggs was the lead in his MGTC and when he arrived at the

turnoff to Dennes Point noticed the road was gravel and it was wet. The decision was made not to travel on that road so we went directly to the ferry terminal instead.

At the terminal many vehicles were lined up to get onto the ferry with some Club members able to board the next available one. Others had to wait for two ferries before boarding. Herby Burgess looked drenched in his MGB open top convertible. It was a smooth trip back to Kettering and everyone had a great experience visiting Bruny Island. For those members that did not make it you missed out on a wonderful Sunday car run.
