### **Adelaide MG National Meeting 2017**


Thirty one members of the MG Car Club of Tas headed to Adelaide to attend the National Meeting.

The North West Coast had had a considerable amount of rain that afternoon and for many it meant taking shelter during the trip to Devonport to ensure that we started out with a dry car.

Loading went very smoothly but that could not be said for the night trip to Melbourne which was a little bumpy, however we all survived.


