

#### **SU Carburettors**

One hundred and ten years ago on the 28th of January 1913, the founders of the SU Carburettors, made a deal with Wolseley and Rover as regular suppliers of SU carburettors. The SU Carburettor was the brainchild of the late George Herbert Skinner and it was later named Skinner & Union, shortened to SU.

In 1926 the company was taken over by William Morris and the Company name changed to SU Carburettors LTD in 1936. By 1939, most Morris and MG vehicles as well as Riley, Wolseley, Alvis and Bentley, were equipped with SU fuel pumps or SU carburettors.

Today, as MG car owners, we are often challenged by DIY tuning these uncomplicated and simple carburettors.

Moss Motors, MG specialist supplier of MG parts in the UK and US; has 'Moss SU Tool Kit', (see right photo) a tuning tool set to adjust the SU, synchronise air flow and adjust fuel mixture strength. Simply Google part number (Moss 386-300) for easy-to-read instructions and illustrated examples to make SU tuning an easy DIY task.

The photo below shows the Moss service tools installed in



the piston of the 2 carbs of my 1960 MGA1600. Since the two pistons of both carburettors are

lifted equally by airflow when the engine is running at normal operating temperature, it is possible to synchronize without a flow meter, by comparing the height of each piston when it's lifted. The higher piston lifts the greater air flow and this allows the

lower piston to be adjusted, to equal the airflow. I like the simplicity of this method of tuning the carbs air flow.



The gold standard for finer accuracy of air flow measurement; however, is a flow meter, commonly called a UNI-SYN MOD-A. (Seen left)

To adjust fuel flow: turn the bronze nut, (see picture below), clockwise to reduce fuel flow and anticlockwise to increase fuel flow. The Moss kit includes a purpose-made miniature spanner to adjust the fuel mixture by the nut at the base of the carburettor.

As I have learnt the hard way, it's important before tuning and adjusting the carburettors on your car, to check all engine details that affect performance. Check engine compression and timing is correct, tappet clearances spark plugs condition and distributor points cleaned and set. (Also check for wear on the distributor cam by side movement of the rotor button).

Be sure to download the Moss SU Tool Kit (part number 386-300) for your simple, yet detailed set of tuning instructions. I also purchased the 20th edition of the SU specification and spare parts catalogue from The SU Carburettor Company LTD in England. It is a 208-page catalogue with A-Z listing.

For any SU modelled MG, you may own, no matter how old, SU guarantee a replacement carburettor of repair or refurbish of your supplied carburettor.

Thanks, George Skinner, for your millions of SU carburettors for cars from Aston Martin, Austin Healey, Bentley, Daimler, Jaguar, Lotus, Rolls Royce, Triumph and to our loved MG.

Time to shine or is it? The concours is approaching and many ask what makes a concours -wining car?

Concours competitions are constantly evolving. Each year, the Pebble Beach Concours has new classes, accommodating new interpretations.

Many aim to restore a car to its new condition yet others consider it desirable to only attend to mechanical wear and leave cars cosmetically untouched, regardless the level of deterioration. Part of me understands this approach. My restored Morris Minor looked new but when I opened the door of an untouched Morrie, I realised my car lost something. The untouched Morrie's interior greeted you with history, a musky aroma built over years and fractured leather cloth exposing horse hair stuffing. The headlining was tinged sepia and paint surfaces worn transparent. The patina of time, an ambiance you cannot recreate. Other enthusiasts make repairs but aim to maintain the cosmetic patina; they will re-upholster using old material salvaged from other cars, arguing: it's a 60-year-old car it should look like it's had 60 years of use. My cousin is a multiple concours winner, he aims for a painful level of perfection; machining and altering a perfect factory bumper so it curves precisely around the guard. He checks all panel gaps with a vernier gauge

achieving accuracy that never existed on the car.

Cars are the expressions of their owners and I personally welcome the different interpretations as they keep concours displays captivating.
